Jerusalem Divrei Torah

Personal Involvement

The first words that Hashem commanded Moshe to relay to the Jewish people about korbonot are: "A person who brings from [among] you a korbon to Hashem."[1] There is a clear emphasis from the very beginning that it is a member of the Jewish people who is bringing the korbon. The midrash[2] contrasts this explicit association of the korbon-bringer as a Jew with the way the Torah describes a person who is discovered to have tzara'as on his body: "If a person has an affliction on the skin of his flesh."[3] The identifying phrase "from [among] you" is missing from the description of the potential metzora. It is as if the Torah wants to hide the fact that this person is part of our nation.

The midrash explains this discrepancy by referring to Hashem's desire to bestow honor on His people. Therefore, the Torah is formulated precisely in the way which discloses the nationality of the anonymous person engaged in the laudable activity of bringing the korbon, but hides the nationality of the metzora.

The midrash compares this notion regarding the Jewish people with a similar idea regarding Hashem. When Hashem is forced to destroy Yerushalayim, he does so through the agency of Gavriel as He does not want to be associated with this action. However, we are promised that the future redemption will be similar to the original exodus from Mitzrayim. Just like originally it was "I and not an angel... I Hashem and no one else" [4] it will be Hashem himself who in the future will rebuild the city and purify the people.

This midrash teaches the importance of associating ourselves and becoming personally involved with positive activities. It brings honor to the Jewish people when someone who is identified as being "from you" brings a korbon. Hashem himself wants to be personally involved, so to speak, with the redemption of the Jewish people and the rebuilding of Yerushalayim.

This last point has clear ramifications for us. If Hashem himself wants to be personally involved and associated with the messianic process, how much more should we be! The dictum of "ve-halachta bidrachav" (imitating Hashem) should obligate us to follow in Hashem's footsteps. We, too, need to become personally involved in the rebuilding of Yerushalayim and associate ourselves with the process of redemption. It is not enough for us to send messengers and let others take care of it. Hopefully, in the merit of our personal involvement with the rebuilding of Yerushalayim, Hashem himself will, in turn, become personally involved as well and fully redeem our people and our city.
