Slaves on Horses

"I have seen slaves on horses and nobles walking on foot like slaves."
[1] Kohelet delineates the absurd, paradoxical and inverted phenomena that Shlomo ha-Melech observed in this world. He describes these occurrences as "mistakes" that emerge from the One on High, things that should never occur but are yet part and parcel of this world. The natural order of things as understood by Shlomo should dictate one reality, and yet the opposite is the case on the ground.

The midrash[2] associates this description of an inverted world with two events. The first occurs in this week's parsha when the Midanim sell Yosef as a slave to the Egyptians. In the words of Rebbi Avin HaLevi:

The child of the maidservant is selling and the child of the slave is buying. Between the two, Yosef is sold and brought down to mitzrayim.

This absurd picture from the parsha is juxtaposed to another absurdity: I have seen servants on horses: This is Nevuchadnetzar who destroyed the Beit ha-Mikdash. That initially he did not enter in it because he was afraid. What did Michael do? He descended and held onto his horse and led him into the Holy of Holies.

Michael, the ministering Angel, lowers himself to lead Nevuchadnetzar into the most sanctified place on earth.

What is the purpose of this midrash? Granted, the sale of Yosef and the destruction of the Beit ha-Mikdash are unnatural and "absurd" events. But what

lesson are we supposed to glean from this observation?

Perhaps the lesson is that we should recognize absurdities as absurdities and not accustom ourselves to unnatural situations. Human beings are cognitively flexible and things which at first are surprising or jarring can quickly become the new normal. While this is adaptiveness can lead to resilience and thriving in adverse environments, it can also jade our senses from things which truly should continue to be jarring.

While Nevuchadnetzar and his empire are long gone, his various heirs have stepped into his role. Since the second century BCE, other religions have built houses of worship on Temple Mount. Close to 1900 years of non-Jewish worship on Temple Mount has shaped the thinking of much of the world.

But this midrash teaches us that we at least have to recognize this phenomenon as absurd and unnatural. It was unnatural for Nevuchadnetzar to step foot into the Holy of Holies and the same is true for any other non-Jew who does so, no matter the number of times and years that it is done.

May we merit to see the natural reality come into existence.


